# Message from Holy Cross CEO — Ross White


The Friends of Holy Cross is a cause very close to my heart. With brain-injured patients remaining at Holy Cross Hospital for many months or years, activities which enhance the experience of patients (in addition to expert medical care, intensive nursing and skilled therapy input), are invaluable for improving the wellbeing of the people we look after. Over the years, the Friends have supported not only patient well-being activities and equipment in support of this (such as replacement ambulances for patient transport) but they have also seed-funded new services such as Music Therapy.

The hospital's 40-bed in-patient unit has been full throughout the summer. Patients enjoyed monthly visits with their families to Marley Manor in Haslemere for afternoon tea, as well as regular offsite visits to our holiday cottage in Selsey. Following a successful upgrade of the kitchen area of the Selsey Cottage earlier this year (part-

in early 2020.

In July, we marked the 10<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the opening of our Physiotherapy Centre. The Centre has a state of the art gymnasium and hydrotherapy pool run by a highly skilled team of physiotherapists. We not only provide services for in-patients, but also offer a vibrant range of outpatient classes to groups and individuals, several 'get fit' series (such as 'Fit to Ski') and a varied seminar series called Let's Talk Physio, all of which are open to the general public. To mark the 10<sup>th</sup> anniversary, we launched a new physiotherapy service aimed at post-natal mums who want to return to fitness.....and they bring their babies along too!
