1. Upcoming celebrations

2. Building work - St Margaret's Project

Work began last week on Thursday 20th April, the contractors are Flint Construction who completed both the refurbishment work in St Joseph's and also St Hugh's back in 2017. They will start on the ground floor of St Margaret's with fitting a lift and making some changes in the female changing room. It is inevitable that this work will cause some disruption, additional noise and dust. Next they will start on the first floor, where walls will be removed to open up the planned office space. The contractors have already installed scaffold and steps which they will use to bring in materials and remove waste via a first floor window to reduce the impact of this work on the ground floor. At the moment we do not have an estimate of when this work will be finished but we anticipate that the offices will be ready for us to use by summer 2024. The plan remains to provide a quiet rest area for use by all staff in St Margaret's.
